She also is occasionally an adjunct professor at United Theological Seminary teaching Black church culture and Womanist theology. She resides in St. Paul with her husband, Dr. Herbert Perkins, founder and primary partner of *ASDIC - Antiracism Study-Dialogue Circle Metamorphosis* and a member of Cherokee Park United Church.
