Supportive Housing Corner

The New Year always brings a time for reflection on the past year and planning for the year to come. The Supportive Housing Committee accomplished much in 2018. We spent much time educating ourselves on the issues around homelessness and affordable housing. We shared some of what we have learned through three Adult Faith Formations sessions and by sponsoring the Bloomington Housing Coalition forum at Oak Grove in November. We advocated for affordable housing through participation in the Bloomington Housing Coalition, Suburban Hennepin County Housing Coalition, and the Homeless Day on the Hill. We, along with many others in the congregation, also helped both financially and through our time and talents by giving to Oasis, Aeon, Safe Nights and VEAP.

As we look to 2019, we continue to support Oasis and Safe Nights (*see below*) financially and are growing our partnership with Aeon. In January we took on a new project of delivering flyers to the residents of the Seasons park complex in Richfield. VEAP's Healthy Food Truck comes to the property with produce, bread and other healthy food twice a month. Participation was low. After the first flyer distribution reminding residents of the delivery date we got an email saying it was the highest participation they had since VEAP started the program 6 months ago. SafeNights -- Every year, several hundred teenagers across the Twin Cities find themselves homeless – without a safe place to spend the night. Because emergency shelters are often over-full or inconveniently located, one out of eight of these young people will have to sleep on the streets, where they are vulnerable to drug and alcohol use, sexual coercion, and in the winter, exposure to cold. This is not a problem that is happening somewhere else. Within walking distance or a short bus ride from Oak Grove, up to ten or more high school students will be temporarily or permanently displaced from their homes this year. **SafeNights** is a start-up non-profit organization that has been licensed to provide immediate, short-term shelter and meals for unaccompanied minors, allowing local partnering agencies to focus their efforts on the health, advocacy, and longer-term needs of these young people in crisis. Our church will be the test site and also a permanent location for **SafeNights**.

We need you! Volunteer to help with meals and to commit to spending one or more nights on-site assisting and supporting students while they are being sheltered. Oak Grove's "Per Capita" Dues For 2019

Every year, PC(USA) churches throughout the country provide financial support to their respective presbytery offices to pay expenses (salaries of presbytery staff and office expenses). The amount of the payment made by each local church to the presbytery office is based on the number of members of record for their church at the beginning of the year. This payment is referred to as the "per capita." The per capita varies from year to year and from presbytery to presbytery based on the estimated costs of a given presbytery office and on the total number of members of record for all the churches in a given presbytery.

For the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area (PTCA), the per capita for 2019 is \$35.70. That means each church in PTCA will make a payment to the presbytery office in 2019 of \$35.70 times the number of members of record for their church. For Oak Grove, our per capita payment in 2019 will total about \$18,000.

Oak Grove members are encouraged to make a financial contribution, separate from their annual pledge, to cover the per capita. In 2018, Oak Grove members made separate per capita contributions accounting for a little less than one-fourth of our total per capita payment to the PTCA. Every dollar received as a separate per capita contribution is a dollar that DOESN'T have to come out of the church's budget for per capita payments to the presbytery, leaving more financial resources available to accomplish the vital mission of our church.

For those of you who use offering envelopes, a designated envelope specifically for per capita is included in your pack. As noted above, for an individual member, the per capita amount is \$35.70. For a couple, it would be \$71.40. Each additional confirmed member in the household would be another \$35.70. **When making a per capita offering, it is important to designate the gift as such so that our Financial Secretary can direct it to the proper account.**

February 17 has been designated Per Capita Sunday, and we encourage members to make their per capita contribution on that day. Steve Robertson, PTCA Treasurer, will visit Oak Grove on Sunday, February 10 to address the congregation about the purpose and importance of your per capita contributions. He will attend both worship services.

**2019 PTCA Adult Mission Trip, March 30 – April 7, 2019,
New Bern, North Carolina
Sponsored by the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance &
Fuller Center Disaster Rebuilders (Habitat)**

Background: Hurricane Florence battered the Carolina Coast for days. Record-breaking rainfall of 30 inches caused catastrophic flooding in towns/cities, farmland, and along the coast. All freeways were under water and already damaged levees were threatened. At least 55 deaths were attributed to the storm. Property damage and economic losses in North Carolina alone reached at least \$17 billion, more than the damage from Hurricanes Matthew and Floyd combined. Since September 2018, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance has led specialized OSHA teams to muck out mud and mold from homes. Rehabilitating those homes will begin in January 2019 in the New Bern area, which experienced the largest amount of damage.

Volunteer work in New Bern, NC: The PTCA mission team will arrive in early April to continue the work already started. The type of construction we will do is rehabbing those homes flooded with 2-4 feet of water. Work will be primarily interior: insulating, drywalling, floors, doors, cabinets and vanities, trimming, painting, etc. We need skilled and unskilled persons to come and learn with a supervisor's guidance. We also need a few individuals for daily meal prep, serving and cleanup.

Housing arrangements: Our host church is Cornerstone Church along US #70 in New Bern, NC. Men and women will be housed in separate buildings. Showers are available. Cots and bunks with mattresses are available for sleeping.

Cost: \$250 which includes room and board, transportation, t-shirt, meals out in New Bern, miscellaneous. Food costs during travel to and from New Bern are the responsibility of each person. **There are a total of 25 spots available for PTCA.**
